The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) has a website where you can verify the license of moving companies. The U.S. DOT number is very useful, especially if you need to file a claim against the mover. In case you are moving within the state, you can confirm with your local consumer affairs agency.

Read Online Reviews

The internet is a good place to find out what clients are saying about the company. There are many useful review sites online, such as Better Business Bureau, Yelp, Google, and Angie's List. You can also check the Better Bureau Business to find out the complaints leveled against the business.

Ensure That They Have a Physical Address

A legitimate moving company will have a physical address. It is highly recommended that you go for a locally established company as it will help to avoid frustrations in the future in case you need to access them for an issue.

Professional Accreditations

Ensure that you hire a company that is a member of a trade association. The companies have to meet certain requirements to be members of trade associations such as the American Moving and Storage Association. This helps to ensure that the company you are choosing is reputable.

Be Wary of Hefty Deposits

You have to acknowledge the fact that a reputable and professional companies won't ask for large deposits or cash payments. If they show signs of greed even before the work is done, move on to the next. Advance payments and cash payments can result in you losing control over the process, and you won't be sure when you'll see them again.

You should also ask for a detailed in-home estimate. Also, inquire if there are any additional costs based on how the move will be conducted. This will help to dodge any unexpected bills. The mover should visit your home and see all the items that will be moved. The mover should show up with their van; otherwise, if it is rented, then it might be a flag that the company isn't professional and experienced.
