Portland-based poet Wendy Chin-Tanner's poems, essays, and interviews have appeared in numerous journals including *The Mays Anthology of Oxford and Cambridge, The Saint Ann's Review*, and *The Raintown Review*. She is a founding editor at *Kin Poetry Journal*, poetry editor at *The Nervous Breakdown*, staff interviewer at *Lantern Review*, co-founder of A Wave Blue World (publisher of graphic novels) and an online sociology instructor at Cambridge University, UK.
